

The Pastor's Pen



"You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." Acts 1:8

On Easter Sunday I preached from the very end of the gospel of Luke. I did that on purpose. I am setting us up for our next Sermon series on the book of Acts. The gospel writer, Luke, wrote the gospel with his name on it, but he also wrote "part two." Part two is the book we know as Acts- sometimes called by its longer name, "The Acts of the Apostles."

Acts picks up the Jesus story where the gospel of Luke leaves off- Jesus ascending into heaven. The rest of the stories in the book of Acts tell us about how the church came into existence, how it endured persecution, how it drafted unlikely leaders, and how it spread throughout the whole known world.

When Luke wrote his two volumes, Luke/Acts, he wrote it to someone named Theophilus. We do not know for sure who that is, but his name means, "lover of God." It could rightly be said that Luke wrote to anyone who has their heart open to God, anyone who wants to love the Lord with greater clarity and conviction. And Luke also makes it really clear why he wrote these two volumes. He said, "I decided to write an orderly account... so that you may know the certainty of the things you have been taught." Luke 1:3-4 Luke wants his reader, us, to have a faith that is built upon historical certainty. In fact Luke was a missionary partner of the Apostle Paul and probably witnessed many of the events recorded in Acts himself. I hope that our journey through this book in the Bible will leave you with a greater appreciation of the miraculous birth of the Church, and a greater certainty of your own faith.

Acts is 28 Chapters long, and I anticipate this series will take the better part of two years to preach through the book. As always we will take some seasonal and topical breaks, along with an occasional guest minister who will be able to bring our congregation something other than Acts. But I don't think you are going to get easily tired of Acts- It is a very narrative driven book with lots of interesting stories- about the Holy Spirit empowering His Church. I pray as we read together we will begin to see Windermere as an ongoing part of this story in which the Holy Spirit is STILL empowering our congregation to change the world with the gospel.







It was no coincidence that Jesus died during Passover. He was the very fulfillment of Passover! He was observed for three years to prove his perfection, just as the spotless lamb was observed for three days before it was sacrificed.

We apply the blood to our hearts, as the blood of the lamb was applied to the doorposts at the escape from Egypt. During Passover, they say "In remembrance of the lamb" while they eat a fragment of matzah, just as Christ said, "This is my body given for you, do this in remembrance of me." The third cup of wine during the Passover meal is the Cup of Redemption. Just before drinking it Christ said, "This cup is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood." The Israelites freedom from slavery is a picture of our freedom from sin and our new life in Christ.
