## The Pastor's Pen

## From Complacency to Zeal

"At that time I will search Jerusalem with lamps and punish those who are complacent, who are like wine left on its dregs, who think, 'The LORD will do nothing either good or bad.'"

Zephaniah 1:12

What do you know about the prophet Zephaniah? Well if I am being honest with you I didn't know a whole lot either! I learned enough about the minor prophet in order to pass the ordination exam, and that is about it! But Zephaniah is part of the Word of God, which means that God still intends it for our benefit and His glory. Starting this month I will be preaching from the book of Zephaniah on the 1st, 3rd, and 5th Sundays in the evenings (4:30-5:30).

The book of Zephaniah was written by the prophet with the same name at a time of great cultural falling away from God. Zephaniah served as the prophet during the last "good king" of Judah, Josiah. After Josiah Israel drifted into total apostasy and all of the warnings of the prophet Zephaniah came to pass. I think the book is filled with timeless lessons that apply to our own culture in an almost uncanny way.

Outside of the United States of America, Christianity in the cultural "West" has virtually been subsumed by secularism. In America, we have also noticed drastic declines in Christianity, however, compared to our European counterparts, America has remained remarkably religious, and that "religion" has more or less remained Christian. It reminds me of what happened in Israel after the splitting of the kingdom in the Old Testament. Northern Israel became increasingly secular, and was ultimately destroyed before Zephaniah was even born, but the southern kingdom, even though generally it was overwhelmed by wicked kings, remained culturally religious toward Yahweh, their God. Judah's faithfulness preserved the kingdom 136 years longer than their northern brethren, but near the end of that 136 years Zephaniah is warning God's people in Judah that the same thing can happen to them if they allow their culture to fall away from God.

I think Zephaniah will be a powerful reminder for us to insist upon faithfulness even when the culture around us makes it difficult or even outright turns against us. It is not enough to be complacent in the face of our own culture ignoring God. When most secular people we know think about God (to the extent they think about Him at all) they think that God won't actually do anything either good or bad. Most people think that our destiny is not up to God, but up to us. Zephaniah is an ancient book but it is also a sobering and helpful book when it comes to living in our own times. It reminds us that God will not remain idle or indifferent toward our indifference to Him. The book reminds us to remain vigilant and zealous toward the things of God. I hope you can join us on Sunday evenings this summer as I preach through this wonderful little book.

June's Mission Spotlight is **Hands4Christ Quilting Ministry**. Since the program started in 2016, 350 quilts have been given to Coastal Horizon's Youth Shelter. Kids, ages 6-18, stay at the Shelter when they have been removed from their homes due to abuse or neglect. It may be just overnight, weeks or even months before the courts decide if they can return to their family, go to a relative's or into foster care. Regardless of where they go,

they'll take a quilt with our hopes and prayers that it brings them comfort and lets them know someone does care.

Some started as early as 4: 30 a.m. opening cans of yams and beans and placing them in large pans along with seasonings and placing them on the outside cookers.

There are 542 people who received a hot meal and may have received their only human contact for the day.




